Who should attend?

RIGS Alliance workshops are designed for genealogists, historians, or librarians who want to improve their research skills and techniques, need an introduction to regional archives, or want guidance with research in original records. This is not a beginner-level workshop. To assure a quality experience, the workshops accommodate a limited number of attendees.

Find and interpret original records

Hands-on sessions in an exciting, integrated curriculum accentuate methodology and problem-solving skills while teaching participants how to effectively access original records. Attendees work in teams to complete assigned projects and to build confidence in research proficiency.

Can you benefit even if you're not researching in the areas where the workshops are being held?

Yes! You will gain skills and knowledge that transfer to the same kinds of record groups and similar documents at any archives—whether national, regional, or local. Learn to create a research plan, use finding aids, read and interpret old handwriting, and analyze materials; then use this knowledge at *any* research repository.

WORKSHOP ACTIVITIES

(Activities, topics, and schedules vary among workshop locations.
See www.RIGSAlliance.org for detailed curriculum.)

All RIGSA workshops include participatory activities that teach and employ practical skills such as:

- Interpreting handwriting (paleography)
- Transcribing and abstracting records
- Citing sources
- Creating a research plan
- Using online and print finding aids (catalogs, NUCMC, Preliminary Inventories, Descriptive Pamphlets, etc.) to locate records
- Using online resources

These skills will be integrated with work in an array of record types, including but not limited to:

- Population and special census schedules
- Federal and local court records (criminal, bankruptcy, naturalization, and others)
- Confederate Court records
- Records of Federal Prisons
- Federal and state military records
- Land records (state and federal)
- Records of the U.S. Postal System
- Records of the Cherokee & Creek Indians, East

Attendees may participate in interactive activities such as a mock court case, a census enumerators' test, and treasure hunts for answers that lie in the original records.

The 2010 workshop will be held at the National Archives at Atlanta (5780 Jonesboro Road, Morrow, Georgia).

LEARNING FACILITIES

Workshop sessions take place in classrooms at the National Archives and Records Administration's Regional System facilities, in close proximity to research rooms. Our classrooms offer Internet access, dry-erase boards, flip charts, and overhead computer projection systems, all the tools we'll need for effective learning sessions. Lunch is brought in Monday through Thursday for workshop attendees.

TUITION

Tuition of \$449 (postmarked by 1 Sep 2010) or \$549 (postmarked 2 Sep 2010 or later) covers all workshop materials and facilities as well as lunch Monday–Friday. Attendees are responsible for their own air and ground transportation and lodging.
